



SWIMWEAR POLICY

Swimwear is important to maintain clean and hygienic water. The higher the bather load, the more important it is to ensure customers are wearing the correct swimwear.

Customers cannot wear clothing in the water. It must be swimwear material made of lycra or neoprene.

Below is more specific information on different user groups.

1 NAPPIES

When completing an enrolment for an infant, the following MUST be discussed.

- All infants that are not toilet trained must wear a disposable swim nappy with tight fitting swimwear over the top.
- The disposable swim nappies are available in bulk via Woolworths, Coles and Aldi.
- Tight fitting swimwear does not include boardshorts or onesies that are loose.

Infants cannot enter the water with a regular nappy on. It will fill until it explodes and causes significant pool filtration issues.

2 ADULTS

Adults must wear swimmers made of lycra or neoprene. Adults cannot wear underwear in the water for hygiene reasons. For modesty reasons, the link below displays options for those wanting to cover up in the water.
